Nelangi Pinto has been interested in addressing disparities to healthcare access throughout her career and has specifically looked at racial and geographic disparities in diagnosis and outcomes. While at the University of Utah she worked with her team her team to adapt a Screening, Brief Intervention, and Referral to Treatment model to identify social vulnerabilities currently used by Intermountain in primary pediatric clinics for the fetal and the pediatric cardiology setting. Now in Seattle she is starting to work with their Heart Center EDI group on efforts to increase access to pediatric cardiac outpatient services and to study how embedded SDOH screening has been implemented specifically with regard to awareness and utilization by providers.
